769. HAMPHIRE COUNTY COUNCILS REPRESENTATIVES REPORT

(to include the Bell Bollards)

Cllr. Thornber congratulated Mr. Norris on his appointment as Chairman. Said he had stood aside from Leadership and has been elected to Chairman of HCC - a move from operational responsibilities to a civic and ceremonial role and chairing county council meetings. Also been reappointed to the NFNPA. Said he has been very involved with the accident that happened to Cllr. Vickers - a car went round the schaines at speed, did not stop and hit Cllr. Vickers, turned the car round three times and hit the back of the car. Cllr. Vickers is in constant pain - this could have been a very serious accident. Said he met with highway officers to discuss various opions and preferred a series of rumble strips on the main road before the Norleywood/Bull Hill crossroads. Had asked for double white lines in the middle of the road, but dept. of transport regulations does not allow this. Asking for chicanes to be made more severe. Discussed staggered crossroads, but Forestry Commision would not be happy to give up the land, but they would gain back the original land. There seems to be a problem with people estimating the speed of oncoming vehicles, they need to slow that traffic. Rumble strips would be audible and have an effect of slightly slowing traffic.

Cllr. Thornber said he has had a good look at the bell bollards, which seem as yet

unscathed and do not seem quite as intrusive as thought, but certainly not in keeping with the posts. Said he has not yet received the traffic report that was done when these were installed. Mr. Norris said he has received comments regarding the traffic lights and these are not prefered, took the fire engine 7 minutes to turnout and they caused massive queues and also

pollution levels to be considered, but in general they do not like the mix of bollards and posts. Some residents feel the posts should be removed, but residents living there want to keep them. Mr. Haas seems happy. One parishioner has been watching the lorries and said they are now aware they are there and they stop, look ahead and move over when the road is clear, to avoid clipping their wheels. Heard that a lorry reversing down the high street nearly clipped the cottage next door to the Haas' and had heard another post might be put in. Cllr. Thornber says in the long term to

press for a lorry ban, but it is going to be very difficult. Mr. Gibbs asked if we could just ban certain size lorries. Cllr. Thornber said it was not impossible, but difficult, would have to consult adjoining parish councils. Said when Mr. Montagu suggested a one way system that Denny Wood objected strongly and has to be sufficient traffic and in particular issues with pedestrians. Will look forward

to seeing the survey. Discussed Ampress Bridge. Mr. Gibbs asked about developers there, could some of the cost be put on the developers. Cllr. Thornber said what they are entitled to say to developers of housing/estates is that they must make a contribution to the infrastructure within that estate, but in terms of major roads, which is our responsibility, then do not think we can ask them. Will check with the Director of Environment.

Mr. Knight mentioned the recent cycling event and that they were stopping the traffic at Ipley coming from Marchwood. Cllr. Thornber said no one has that legal authority. Said he thought they had an agreement with the organisers that they observe the highway code. Said they are watching them carefully and the organisers know if they have continued problems we will seek a traffic prohibition order.
