### 827. NEW FOREST DISTRICT COUNCILS REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

Cllr. Vickers said the cycling events are now causing concern to the DC, as a number of events involve either road closures or changes to speed restrictions. That involves putting out public notices and the accumulated costs of these events is not a trivial matter and they are reviewing the position. Feel a number of these organisations should carry the costs that they are creating.

Cemetery – said they have approx. 2 years space left. Next phase is environmental accessments, which take one year and will cost the DC £32,000.

Sign posting – reported that the stumbling block has been the listed building consent, which is an almost insurmountable problem. There is a solution and as it is on highways land can just be inacted. The proposal is to bring the two wooden posts at the bottom of the High Street closer together and then could put across between the two posts, two separate arrowed markers 1) car park sign and 2) 3 symbols for a brown sign. The highways proposal for through traffic issues is to put arrows in the road with 'through traffic' written in wording and the arrow taking you around the corner. This can just be delivered as it does not need

anyone's permission.

Precept – said we would be starting to think about this and wanted to mention what is happening with council tax benefit system. The government decided that people who are on council tax benefit would no longer be paid by the government, but by the DC. When they made that decision they only transferred to the council 90% of the money, so very large shortfall, as those getting council tax benefit, some goes to county, some district and some to you, so when you set your precept and have someone in your parish who cannot pay, then that money use to come through that system. The government when making that decision were thinking of large council and forgot little parishes existed, so for one year only they gave the DC £400,000 to buffer the problem for the 37 Town and Parishes that make up the NF district. Certain changes were made to try and make up the 10% shortfall. The £400,000 does not exist anymore so DC have decided that they will remove that funding over three years and plug the gap out of DC money. So parish councils will have to fund either by raising the precept to make up the difference or finding some economies. Mr. Norris felt that the charities we support will suffer.

Said they are freezing parking charges again in January.

Mr. Norris mentioned that the SLR has been damaged and Cllr. Vickers said this needs to be returned to the manufacturer.

Cllr. Vickers said some parishes were getting together re a speed gun.

# 828. BROWNS LANE

Mr. Norris said we had received a letter from John Beaumont asking for our support in getting Browns Lane on the definitive map as a public footpath. HCC says it is not a right of way. Some councilors went on a site visit. Browns Lane goes down to Sowley Gate House, then down a little path and then to the beach. Sowley Gate House owns Browns Lane and the path to the beach and to the low tide mark. The owners of Browns Lane have allowed people to go there and on to

the beach. Local people regard it as a private lane, but know that if they are sensible and behave then no one will stop them. The reason the gate at the bottom was erected was because they were having major problems with fishermen, 30-40 at a time at night with search lights and endless cars in Sowley Lane. The litter is appalling and sometimes the people are abusive. Discovered these people are not locals. Someone will catch an interesting fish like a stringray and notify people via an internet chat room and then fishermen start arriving from London, the Midlands, all over, parking and blocking Browns Lane. The noise can be quite loud and they walk through gardens. Mr. Norris said it is a very precious and sensitive area and if it gets opened it would have to be 'policed' or it will be ruined. The owners shut the gate at night just to stop the fishermen. Mr. Norris said that Mr. Beaumont has advanced his case extremely well and agrees we need more coastal access, but in this case we will remain disinterested, and should it become a public footpath right away then we become very interested. Feels local existing arrangement is working really well.

## 829. WEBSITE

Mrs. McCafferty and Mrs. Shanks have met with Trevor and the website is

looking good and there is useful information on there and the links are good. Mr. Norris said it will be very useful to alert the parish to certain happenings, like robberies, travelers on the move etc. Also the neighborhood watch. Jill's shop was recently burgled and she has arranged a meeting of the community for 29<sup>th</sup> October at 5.30 in the Deli with PC Chris Yates, security from the Estate and Jo Cooke-Hurle will attend. Mr. Weiss will be attending and will say that we are there to help. Mrs. Steele will also try and attend. Mr. Norris feels we should be seen to support this.

### 830. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

The parish received a letter last month from the Royal British Legion saying the Branch had folded and the banners have been laid up in Beaulieu Church. Decided as a parish council we should present a wreath on behalf of the parish for the war dead. Said if we do not do this then there will hardly be any wreath laying. Said we cannot represent the British Legion, we have to represent ourselves. Mr. Norris as Chairman will lay the wreath at 9.30a.m. on Remembrance Sunday.
