1861. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

Norris agreed as on going and needs sorting. Cllr. Norris asked if the High Street looked clean and swept this morning. Cllr. Steele said it was lovely, but astonishing how many parked cars there are. Back to normal on parking front.

1866. HAMPSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL'S REPRESENTATIVES REPORT

Cllr. Mans said they had a full council meeting on line and brought everyone up to date. Formed local outbreak engagement board to ensure with the advice from Public Health England, what we need to do if any increase in positive tests locally. Aim is to control the virus, but ensure we have up to date info and where positive tests are and that info should be sent to us asap. Said this is up and running. Still reduction in cases and no deaths this week. Regarding recovery – encourage retailers, hospitality to open, want to get economy back to normal. Government have given us extra £7 ½ m. Pandemic has cost us £100m, now just under £100m, step in right direction. Cllr. Steele said if we have local

lockdowns, will there be more of a role that PC's have to play? Cllr. Mans said I do not think anything is written down for PC's to do. Said if there is something I think you can help with, I will get in touch. Cllr. Norris said we would be happy to help. Had a small outbreak in Gosport in a pub, but landlord managed to ring everyone, even before asked. Cllr. Norris said the pub up the road from the outbreak also went into lockdown. That response was brilliant, good we are all trying to help each other.

1867. **NEW FOREST DISTRICT COUNCILS REPRESENTATIVES REPORT** Cllr. Harris not present.

1868. PLANNING

20/00459 – Land at New House. Letter of support from Beaulieu Estate. Sandy and Penny are present. Determination as to whether prior approval is required for the construction of 2 linked water storage reservoirs for agricultural purposes. Penny said Sandy runs NF Fruit Company and is one of the UK growers and producers of some of the counties soft fruit. 3,000 tones grown a year, distributed direct to UK supermarkets and now produce 15 tones of asparagus a year. Strong increase in demand. Biggest agricultural business in the NF. 60 full time managers and workers, 400 staff at peak times. The farms location provides ideal growing conditions for fruit with longer daylight hours and warmer temperatures on south coast. Modern growing systems, very long picking season, March – end November. Reduces requirement on imports and associated food miles from Europe and South America, which provide a lot of out of season asparagus crop. Crops in glasshouses and polytunnels, max use of irrigation system. Need a guaranteed water supply during summer months to enable us to continue to supply quality produce and future vibrancy of the company. Existing farm reservoir not able to serve that need for water. Use of mains water is not viable or environmentally sustainable, look at new water storage facility, extraction from nearby stream during high flows and winter season and subsequent use of stored water for the following summer. In discussion with Environmental Agency and extraction license has been applied for. Environmental Agency have no objections. Site is currently arable land, close to farms underground ring main. Very well screened on all sides, hedges and high woodland. Exterior banks planted with wild flowers. No increase in visitors, low profile, no visual impact, no lose of habitat for wildlife. New reservoirs will help secure the business, reduce food miles and allow people to buy British. Cllr. Norris said lots of boxes ticked and excellent presentation. Asked if there are any H&S issues, re trespasses. Penny said a fence will soon be erected around it. Cllr. Steele asked where the water was being extracted from? How transported? Fleets of lorries? Replied have a reservoir outside Grinding Stone, overflow from Hatchet Pond and pumped underground to farm, and then 200m from existing reservoir to proposed ones. Cllr. Grindrod has concerns about amount of vehicles coming and going. Sandy said the heavy machinery will arrive and stay till finished. Only couple of cars/vans bringing workers.

Vote – 7 councilors in favour of No. 1. Cllr. Shanks disagreed with No. 1. Proposed: Cllr. Reece Seconded: Cllr. Steele

Cllr. Norris said congratulations and wish you luck.

1869. CORRESPONDENCE

Application for Premises License for Queensmead Village Shop. To permit sales. Cllr. Shanks said she is struggling with how you can sell sweets/toys and alcohol. Cllr. Steele said she spoke to a tenant who wants to reopen as a village shop as locals want basic food, bread, veg, ice creams and there would be one shelf of wine and spirits and will only be viable if community supports her. Cllr. Steele feels good to have local shop that people can walk to and buy basics, rather like Ian at EB. Will open at 9am which means missing workers on their way to work. Cllr. Shanks said will there be a conflict with the Abbey Stores. Cllr. Steele said current format is closed, post office closed. Will be half shop, half office. Will be refurbished and let to someone. Cllr. Grindrod worried about staff selling alcohol if Angie not there. Need strict rules. Cllr. Dearing concerned about late opening. Cllr. Norris feels let this letter lie and see what happens and if we have concerns contact NFDC. Cllr. Norris said the tenant is a hard worker and we wish her well.
